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Introduction:

The Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) of students on curricular aspect is used to improve the quality of academics and enrichment of academic facilities at college. In this Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS), the academic component such as objective of the course, relevance of syllabus, allocation of marks and evaluation process of course, scientific advancement, laboratory component, etc. are covered.

Objectives of the feedback:

The objective of Survey is to understand the students' point of view and satisfaction on some important parameters to guide the future of Higher Education. It is expected to provide accurate information for the better Higher Education system, which is responsive to students. The contents of the Questionnaire used purely for academic and dissemination of students' views and will be kept confidential. The guideline includes the method of online survey, clarification on the questionnaire and the sample selection of students. The co-ordinator conducts a meeting of all the faculty members of the college to clarify the guidelines of the online survey. In case the meeting is not possible, then Coordinator is supposed to convey the important points of conducting the online survey telephonically.

Process of Students Satisfaction Survey

The following points are important in the conduct of the survey.

- 1. Method of Online Survey.
- 2. Sample Selection of Students in an Institute
- 3. Clarification on the Questionnaire
- 4. Selection of the Date/Week for the Conduct of the Survey

1. Method of Online Survey

The questionnaire is to be filled up through an online survey. The student will be required to go through the Google Form provided by the college and respondent will have to click on SSS online questionnaire. Thereafter online questionnaire main page will open. There is an option of filling up the questionnaire in English Language. Student may begin to fill up the questionnaire. When the first page of the questionnaire is filled up then only navigation to the next page will take place. In case, it is not possible to fill up the questionnaire due to internet connectivity or any other reason then it is requested that questionnaire is filled up offline and the printed version is sent to Co-ordinator, NAAC Criterion II.

2. Sample Selection of Students

It is the initiative and responsibility of the Co-ordinator to conduct the survey. The Co-ordinator may facilitate the task of conducting the survey by assigning a teacher the responsibility of conducting the survey. Our college select all the students from B.Sc. and B.A. course. The idea is to take 20 percent of total students as a sample students. From these 20 Percent of students, we select only students who are regular in attending the classes; it is better to select students with at least 60 per cent of attendance.

3. Clarification on the Questionnaire

Questionnaire is purely objective type and except 2-3 places where name, college detail is to be filled up, a student has to tick with the help of cursor. First of all, general information has to be filled up. In general information student has to fill the information such as Email id, Name of the student, Name of the college, Name of the degree, Name of faculty and Contact details. Out of the many options student is supposed to tick only one option. Then there are questions on Syllabus, teachers, teaching methods, examination and graduate outcome, campus and governance, skills and employability, capabilities of students and students' representation. Most of the questions relate to satisfaction level of students. Satisfaction level is to be given on 5 point scale. 5 indicate lowest level of satisfaction and 1 indicates highest level of satisfaction. 4 is on lowest scale of satisfaction and 2 is on the higher level of satisfaction whereas 3 indicates average level of satisfaction. Students are advised to tick appropriate option based on their experiences in the college.


4. Selection of the Date/Week for the Conduct of the Survey

The Students Satisfaction survey for the academic year 2019-2020 is conducted at the end of session. Due the COVID-19 pandemic situation this year college conducted online Students Satisfaction survey from 2nd week of July 2020 to 2nd week of August 2020

Analysis of Students Satisfaction Survey

The forms of students satisfaction survey were provided to 536 number of students in online mode during academic session 2019-2020. 163 number of students responded to students satisfaction survey were (30%). The student's satisfaction survey form includes 20 questions on curriculum, college development and college facility aspects. The question wise student responses received are recorded in the following table. The student students satisfaction survey feedback is also graphically represented in figure.
