Introduction:

The Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS) of students on curricular aspect is used to improve the quality of academics and enrichment of academic facilities at college. In this Students Satisfaction Survey (SSS), the academic components such as objectives of the course, relevance of syllabus, allocation of marks and evaluation process of course, scientific advancement, laboratory component, etc. are covered.

Objectives of the Survey:

Following points are taken into account for Student Satisfaction Survey

- 1. To measure and improve the student satisfaction level on their experiences with college facilities like infrastructure, physical facilities, etc.
- 2. To identify and improve the student satisfaction level about the student support services.
- 3. To measure and improve the student satisfaction level about the teacher communication.
- 4. To understand and advance the student satisfaction level about the quality of teaching-learning resources.
- 5. To identify and improve the student satisfaction level about the teaching environment.
- 6. To measure the effectiveness of teaching methods adopted by the teachers.
- 7. To understand and improve the student satisfaction regarding the internal assessment evaluation by the department.
- 8. To measure and improve the quality of social and mental health of the students.
- 9. To measure the effectiveness of mentor-mentee scheme and accordingly make necessary changes in the existing scheme.
- 10. To conduct the SWOT analysis and accordingly arrange programs to help the students to improve their personality.

Process of Students Satisfaction Survey


The following points are taken into account for conducting the survey.

1. Method of Online Survey

The questionnaire is to be filled up through an online survey. The student will be required to go through the Google Form provided by the college and respondent will have to click on SSS online questionnaire. Thereafter online questionnaire main page will open. There is an option of filling up the questionnaire in English Language. Student may begin to fill up the questionnaire. When the first page of the questionnaire is filled up then only navigation to the next page will take place. In case, it is not possible to fill up the questionnaire due to internet connectivity or any other reason then it is requested that questionnaire to be filled up offline and the printed version should be sent to Co-ordinator, NAAC Criterion II.



2. Sample Selection of Students

It is the initiative and responsibility of the SSS Co-ordinator to conduct the survey. The Co-ordinator may facilitate the task of conducting the survey by assigning a teacher the responsibility of conducting the survey. SSS google form has been sent to all the students of B.A. and B.Sc. course. The student's satisfaction survey in the form of google form were sent to the all students (584) through the WhatsApp group or email. All the students were instructed to fill the SSS Google form within the time limit (2nd week of July to 2nd week of August). After the completion of time limit all the data collected from Google form. After this, coordinator of Criteria with committee members analyzed and interpreted the data.

3. Designing and finalization of Questionnaire

Questionnaire is purely objective type and except general information in which student has to fill the information such as Email id, Name of the student, Name of the college, Name of the degree, Name of faculty and Contact details. Then there were 20 questions on Syllabus, teachers, teaching methods, examination and graduate outcome, campus and governance, skills and employability, capabilities of students and students' representation. In Questionnaire 5 options were given and student was supposed to tick only one option. Most of the questions relate to satisfaction level of students. Satisfaction level is to be given on 5 point scale. 5 indicate lowest level of satisfaction and 1 indicates highest level of satisfaction. Students are advised to tick appropriate option based on their experiences in the college.

4. Schedule of the Survey

The Students Satisfaction survey for the academic year 2020-2021 was conducted at the end of session. Due the COVID-19 pandemic situation, college was conducted online Students Satisfaction survey during 2nd week of July 2021 to 2nd week of August 2021.

5. Collection of data and information from Questionnaire

The students satisfaction survey includes 20 questions comprising of teaching learning process, relevance of syllabus, allocation of marks and evaluation process of course, scientific advancement, laboratory component etc. Data and information regarding SSS Questionnaire has been collected from the student in the form of google form.

6. Analysis and interpretation of collected data and information

The forms of students satisfaction survey were provided to 586 number of students in online mode during academic session 2020-2021. 183 number of students were responded to the students satisfaction survey. The student's satisfaction survey form includes 20 questions on curriculum, college development and college facility aspects. The question wise student responses were received and recorded in the following table. The student students satisfaction survey feedback is also graphically represented from figure 1 to figure 20.



2. How well did the teacher prepare for the classes? 183 responses



3. How Well were teachers able to communicate? 183 responses



4. Overall impression about online teaching learning. 183 responses



5. Fairness of the online/ offline internal evaluation process by the teachers. 183 responses



6. Internet connectivity at your home for online teaching learning / distant education? 183 responses




Figure No. 6 47.5 % of students gave very good and only 4.4 % of students gave below average remarks





9. How helpful are your teachers while studying online? 183 responses





11. Your mentor does a necessary follow up with the assigned task to you. 183 responses



12.The teacher illustrate the concept through the examples and application 183 responses



13.The teacher identify your strength and encourage you with providing right level of challenges. 183 responses

















It is found that in the survey less than 10 % of students gave ave age remarks for syllabus completion, communication skills, soft skills, life skills, employability skills.
